Our goal is to try something new, or to take what you are already doing to a new level of connection within the community.

We have 6 parts to our challenge, and each section features a crest that can be earned separately. Please think outside the box and feel free to substitute activities as long as the substitutions are age appropriate and sufficiently challenging for the level of girls involved to meet the spirit of the objective.

Remember to take photos when participating in your service projects, and **ALWAYS wear your uniform!**





Sparks & Brownies: must complete 3 separate activities or events from a category (note that you could complete the same activity at three separate occasions, for example: 3 litter pick up meetings).



Guides & **Pathfinders**: must complete 4 separate activities or events from a category, for a total of at least 4 hours of service.





Rangers & Adults: must complete 5 separate activities or events from a category, for a total of at least 5 hours of service.



Help Our Guiding Sisters

- Help plan, create or decorate a float or participate in a parade
- Put up posters in local libraries, community stores or malls
- Plan a camp or activity for another branch
- Have a tea party for your local Trefoil Guild
- Collect money for another WAGGGS country
- Collect craft supplies for a new unit opening or for a unit that needs supplies
- Participate in a Twinning project
- Assist at adult or girl events
- Write an article for the newsletter about "Why I am in Guiding" or "How Guiding has changed my life"
- Create an article for the newsletter or local paper that highlights what you have done to earn this challenge
- Write thank you notes to your meeting place, or those that help in your unit
- Discuss with the girls who helps Guiding in your community and write a thank you card to them; take a picture of the girls delivering the note with a box of cookies and submit it for publication
- Nominate another Guider to receive a formal Guiding Award – send your letter to the Area Awards Adviser

- Quilt blankets for the homeless
- Knit hats for the homeless

- Plant flowers for the seniors
- Ask your local municipal councils if Guiding can paint over a graffiti covered wall or bench
- Organize and participate in a community candlelight walkabout
- Clean up the graffiti around your town or meeting space
- Visit the sick children in the hospital (at Halloween, Christmas, other times)
- Do a book drive to support a local school or daycare centre
- Make up some care packages for the local SPCA
- Take part in Remembrance Day ceremonies
